Dr Floyd’s Canine Dentistry Seminar

During the summer Dr. Floyd, a canine dentist, held a seminar at Cleo Home’s house. It was well attended by our members and one of them, Patti Silver, sent a note to Pam Satlof about her experience with a checkup of Rosie at Dr. Floyd’s office.

Hi Pam:

Rosie went to see Dr. Floyd yesterday, and I am really glad we did. He is just excellent and will really do her a lot of good, I think. He did some dental work, which looks great, gave me something different to brush her teeth with, which he feels will really help. I guess she is one of those schnauzers who build up lots of stuff in their mouths. Also, he took x-rays of her jaw because he says that the schnauzer breed, especially as they start to age, is one of the breeds who has trouble dealing with bone density lose. Not all dogs are plagued by it, but some are. He says Rosie is starting to show a little bit of signs of it, but he approves of her diet. He especially wants to watch her front lower tooth, as there isn't much space on her tiny jaw bone for all her teeth, and that one is showing signs of the root disappearing. So we go back in 6 months. Dr Floyd had another vet there with him while we were there. This doctor saw a similar seminar that we viewed, and he came down from Reno to learn more about Dr. Floyd's techniques. Cleo did Rosie and me a HUGE favor by organizing that seminar.

October follow-up:

Please pass on to everyone whose schnauzers have “teeth” problems:

Dr. Floyd worked a miracle on Rosie. When I attended the meeting where Dr. Floyd gave his presentation, I was using the CET toothpaste on Rosie. It was better than nothing, but only just. I didn't know anything else. I took Poole to Dr. Floyd, he cleaned her teeth (and she had just had them cleaned 6 months previous) and he put a “splint” on her front uppers, which were becoming wobbly. And he started us using a different CET product, which is a liquid, and much more effective. That was in April. In August, I took Poole back because her splint fell out. He and I were amazed. Her teeth looked so much better, and the front uppers were no longer bleeding and wobbly. He installed a new splint, and said to bring her back in December. IF her teeth continue to improve like this, he will remove the splint entirely. So no lost teeth! Isn't that good news?

Traveling Gourmet

In all of our travels to the various dog shows we come across a lot of fine restaurants. Of course we “only” eat at the very best – hehe. This section won me the 1990 AMSC Newsletter of the Year award and is being brought back for your enjoyment.

Girdle Mountain Summer House – Belt, Montana

Sherle Hable owns and operates this restaurant named for a nearby mountain once called Girdle but now called Belt. Open for dinner only. A five-course gourmet dinner is featured Wednesday through Sunday. Closed Monday and Tuesday and from January 1 to April 1. Reservations necessary.

Mousse Amaretto

5 Eggs
½ Cup of Sugar
1/8 Tsp. Vanilla
1 Cup of Milk
1 Envelope of Gelatin (1 Tbs.)
2 Tbs. Cold Water
1 Pint of Heavy Cream, Whipped
2 to 3 Oz. Amaretto

Beat egg yolks with sugar until mixture is light yellow. Add salt. Add vanilla to milk and bring to a boil in a 2-quart saucepan. Add milk to beaten egg yolks, mixing thoroughly. Warm over low heat, stirring constantly. **Do not bring to a boil.** Soften gelatin in cold water and add to milk. Strain mixture through a fine sieve (if you put a bowl of softened gelatin in hot water and stir well, then you do not have to strain mixture). Cool on a big bowl of ice, stirring constantly to prevent lumps. Then fold in whipped cream. Beat egg whites until stiff but not dry. Fold into mixture. Add Amaretto. Pour into serving bowl or individual dessert dishes and chill. If desired, before serving, float a tablespoon of Amaretto on the top of each portion. Provides 8 to 10 servings.

Angel Cake Lemon Lorene

4 Egg Yolks
½ Cup Sugar
3 Tbs. Fresh Lemon Juice
½ Tsp. Grated Fresh Lemon Rind
1 Cup heavy Whipping cream
1 Baked Angel Food Cake
Grated Lemon Rind

Beat egg yolks and gradually add sugar, lemon juice and lemon rind. Cook in double boiler, stirring constantly until thickened. Whip cream. Gently combine the whipped cream and the lemon mixture. Serve over angel food cake. Sprinkle with grated lemon rind. Serves 8 to 10.
